Ms. Holder,

I serve on the board of the **Hershel "Woody" Williams Medal of Honor Foundation**. Woody is a WW II Marine Corps veteran who earned the Medal of Honor for his bravery during the battle for Iwo Jima. He was presented the medal by President Truman on October 5, 1945, three days after his 22nd birthday. Woody is 97 years old, he lives near Huntington, West Virginia.

In 2013, Woody launched his foundation with a mission to place monuments in communities to honor, recognize and increase awareness of Gold Star Families. He was in Pensacola this week to dedicate the 75th monument at the Veterans Memorial Park.

While at the park on Thursday morning he discovered the notes and drawings your students left at the park's newest monument, the *Gold Star Families Memorial Monument*, that Woody dedicated on Wednesday November 11th. I found your name and the name of the school on one of the notes.

He was impressed with your student's artwork and messages for veterans. He was pleased to read that many of the students thanked veterans for their freedom. When Woody enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1943, it was because he wanted to help preserve our freedom.

During WW II there were 472 Medal of Honors awarded, there are only two living recipients -Woody and Charles Colidge who lives in Tennessee. Charles served in the U.S. Army in Europe and Woody served in the Pacific. He is the last U.S. Marine Corps Medal of Honor recipient from WW II.

He did read all the notes and even signed a couple. He asked me to return them and to express his gratitude to the students.

The U.S. Navy uses a term to express a job well done – *Bravo Zulu*. The students of Bellview Middle School have certainly earned a "*Bravo Zulu*" from a special Marine.

Please share an address that I can use to return the notes to the students.

We can never totally thank veterans for what they have done for us but we should take every opportunity to thank and honor them for their service. The cards your students are leaving at the Veterans Memorial Park are a wonderful example of thanking and honoring veterans.

Woody is 97 years old and became a Marine in 1943. He is still helping protect and defend America with his work with Gold Star Families.
