Friday November 13, 2020

Ms. Holder,

I serve on the board of the **Hershel "Woody" Williams Medal of Honor Foundation**. Woody is a WW II Marine Corps veteran who earned the Medal of Honor for his bravery during the battle for Iwo Jima. He was presented the medal by President Truman on October 5, 1945, three days after his 22nd birthday. Woody is 97 years old, he lives near Huntington, West Virginia.

In 2013, Woody launched his foundation with a mission to place monuments in communities to honor, recognize and increase awareness of Gold Star Families. He was in Pensacola this week to dedicate the 75th monument at the Veterans Memorial Park.

While at the park on Thursday morning he discovered the notes and drawings your students left at the park's newest monument, the *Gold Star Families Memorial Monument*, that Woody dedicated on Wednesday November 11th. I found your name and the name of the school on one of the notes.

He was impressed with your student's artwork and messages for veterans. He was pleased to read that many of the students thanked veterans for their freedom. When Woody enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1943, it was because he wanted to help preserve our freedom.

During WW II there were 472 Medal of Honors awarded, there are only two living recipients -Woody and Charles Colidge who lives in Tennessee. Charles served in the U.S. Army in Europe and Woody served in the Pacific. He is the last U.S. Marine Corps Medal of Honor recipient from WW II.

He did read all the notes and even signed a couple. He asked me to return them and to express his gratitude to the students.

The U.S. Navy uses a term to express a job well done – *Bravo Zulu*. The students of Bellview Middle School have certainly earned a "*Bravo Zulu*" from a special Marine.

Please share an address that I can use to return the notes to the students.

I will share with Woody the background of your students. One of his daughters is an ASL teacher in Huntington, West Virginia so he knows that teachers are special. I have known Woody for over ten years and have heard him give credit for his patriotism to one of this teachers that taught him about how freedom is precious. He grew up in a very rural part of West Virginia in the 1920's, he attended a one room school house and had the same teacher for the first eight years of his education.

Please share my email with others at the school, it is a great story that is worth sharing.

Again, thank you for the reply and for your efforts to support veterans. We live in a great country but it will only remain that way if young men and women volunteer to protect and defend her. We can never totally thank veterans for what they have done for us but we should take every opportunity to thank and honor them for their service. The cards your students are leaving at the Veterans Memorial Park are a wonderful example of thanking and honoring veterans.

Woody is 97 years old and became a Marine in 1943. He is still helping protect and defend America with his work with Gold Star Families.

PHYSICAL

(Health examinations performed by licensed health professionals outside of Florida are acceptable as long as the documented exam meets minimum requirements and was completed within 1 year of the first day the student will attend school. The school nurse will review all out of state physicals to determine if they meet District requirements.)

IMMUNIZATION RECORDS

U VERIFICATION OF AGE

(If the first prescribed evidence is not available, the next evidence obtainable in the order set forth below shall be accepted:

- a duly attested transcript of the child's birth record filed according to law with a public officer charged with the duty of recording births; or
- a duly attested transcript of a certificate of baptism showing the date of birth and place of baptism of the child accompanied by an affidavit sworn to by the parent(s); or
- an insurance policy on the child's life which has been in force for at least two (2) years; or
- a bona fide contemporary Bible record of the child's birth accompanied by an affidavit sworn to by the parent(s); or
- a passport, a certificate of arrival in the United States, or a naturalization certificate showing the age of the child; or
- a transcript record of age shown in the child's school record of at least four (4) years prior to application, stating date of birth; or
- an affidavit of age sworn to by the parent and accompanied by a certificate of age, signed by a public health officer or by a licensed practicing physician designated by the School Board, stating that the health officer or physician has examined the child and believes that the age as stated in the affidavit is substantially correct (only if other evidence cannot be produced).
- Children who are experiencing homelessness as defined in 39.0016, F.S., shall be given temporary exemption from this section for thirty (30) school days.)

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (optional)

(The Social Security Number is **NOT** required to register a student. You are only required to ask if they have one. The person enrolling does not have to provide it. If it is provided, do **NOT** make a copy of it, you are only verifying the number.)
