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Salary & Wages

- Our ranking indicates we are not currently competitive in the education market.
- A decreasing budget for instructional staff is unusual and indicative of instructional staff loss at every level or at the very least the veteran staff level. Pay cuts are eliminated as an excuse since the mandate to raise salaries.

• "Split Class" M.O.U.

 The "Split Class" memorandum of understanding should be revisited. We understand that the Escambia County School District wish to no longer use ESSER funding however the district can instead use the budget for substitutes to fund the memorandum of understanding. Many school districts use the unused portion of the substitute budget to supplement teacher pay as their workload increases with having to attend to more students in the classroom. Last year there was a revised budget of \$2.7 million and approximately \$4.5 million used by June.
