GENERAL PROCEDURES TO FOLLOW FOR EMERGENCY EVACUATION:

Move evacuated students to the nearest safe location at least 100 feet (approximately 3 bus lengths) from the school bus. The dispersal / regrouping area must be upwind of any fire situation.

Identify which students might run following evacuation so they could be evacuated with the driver or aide.

Wheelchair, ESE students require special handling during school bus evacuation. Blankets Should be carried on all lift buses.

Chaperons or teachers on field trips should be assigned to areas where they could be the most help in the event of an emergency.
