Farm Credit of Northwest Florida's AgVocator Scholarship Program is offering one scholarship up to \$24,000 to a high school senior, college freshman or sophomore with plans to pursue a career in agriculture. This scholarship will cover \$3,000 for eight semesters totaling \$24,000 for a student's tuition throughout their four year undergraduate degree. Farm Credit will provide a paid internship during their junior or senior year of college, after receiving the scholarship for two semesters. If you're planning to go into production agriculture, ag education, ag economics, agri-business or another field related to agriculture, you are eligible to apply.

The scholarship will be awarded to an individual based on their involvement in agriculture, their rural community, academics, leadership qualities, and their passion for being a voice for agriculture.

Eligibility:

- Must be a high school senior in good academic standing or high school graduate within the prior 2 years who otherwise meets all standards (for current college students, scholarship will be prorated based on semesters remaining in degree).
- · Preference will be given to students involved in 4-H or FFA.
- Students in private, public and home school programs are eligible to apply.
- Residency within the Association's chartered territory in Northwest Florida including: Madison, Jefferson, Taylor, Leon, Franklin, Liberty, Wakulla, Gadsden, Bay, Calhoun, Gulf, Holmes, Jackson, Washington, Escambia, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa or Walton counties.

Linear family members of employee, Directors and YBS Farmer Advisory Committee Members of Farm Credit of Northwest Florida are not eligible to apply. Linear is defined as the children, grandchildren and great grandchildren including by adoption

Application Process:

- · Complete the attached scholarship application form.
- · Provide a copy of most recent high school or college transcript.
- Provide a resume of work history, activities, honors and volunteer efforts.
- 2 page essay or a 2 minute video explaining your plans to contribute to your rural community and/or the agriculture industry post-graduation.
- · Two letters of recommendation for the AgVocator Scholarship
- The top three candidates will be contacted to attend an in-person interview on March 26, 2024.

Requirements of the Recipient:

- The recipient will be required to complete a paid summer, fall
 or spring internship with Farm Credit of Northwest Florida
 during their junior or senior year of classes, after receiving the
 scholarship for two semester. Internships at Farm Credit include a
 ten-week commitment and will offer hands on experience in areas
 such as lending, credit, executive management, loan accounting,
 operations, marketing, human resources and more.
- The recipient will be a part of the elite Farm Credit of Northwest Florida AgVocator Scholars. When the Association is participating in career fairs or other networking events close to the student, they will be invited to attend with Farm Credit staff, schedule permitting.
- Maintain a 2.5 or above average GPA throughout their program.
- Provide end of semester transcript to have next tuition stipend sent to the college.

Applications are accepted now through February 23, 2024 at 5 p.m. CT/6 p.m. ET. Email completed application and supporting materials to AgVocator@FarmCredit-FL.com.

Guidelines for Recipient

- The scholarship funds will be sent directly to the college or university.
- Transcript of final semester grades are to be provided to AgVocator@FarmCredit-FL.com at the end of each semester.
 Transcripts must be submitted timely to maintain the balance of the remaining scholarship.
