## **Medical Emergency Cards and Registration Cards**

For the safety of the student, please fill out these cards completely and return as quickly as possible. This will allow the school to make sure that a student is released to the correct person. NHS wants parents to feel secure in the fact that everything will be done to ensure the safety and well -being of the student. These cards contain valuable information which is necessary to get the student medical attention which is correct and which is timely.

- 1. List all persons who are anticipated to check out the student. Students are <u>not</u> released to individuals <u>not</u> listed. Each individual who checks a student out of school must show a valid driver's license.
- 2. List the parents who are permitted to check out the student. The custodial parent (parent of residence) must advise the school as to the circumstances of the non-custodial parent. (For example Mr. Fred Jones, Tim's father, may pick Tim up from school only on Fridays at 2:45 p.m.) it is asked that shared-parenting decisions which affect a student, such as who is authorized to pick up or check out the student, be resolved and communicated between the parents, without the involvement of the school. Shared parenting decisions as to who is placed on the bus card should be made in a timely manner between parents. The school will abide by the information on the blue card, unless the information is found to be in conflict with the most recent court decision involving custody. A student is **never** released by a note only.
- 3. Verbal permission from a faculty/staff member does not exempt students from checking out properly through attendance. Failure to do so will result in a "skipping school offense" for the student.
- 4. List all medications, which the student takes, whether at home or at school. This is most important, if a student should ever have a delayed reaction to some medication taken at home. Please, remember that the student is prohibited by district policy from possessing <u>any</u> medication at school, whether prescription or not. This includes something as simple as aspirin. Students who need ready access to inhalers need to have their parents contact the Health Tech for proper procedure.
- 5. List all phone numbers and alert the school at once, if there is a change.
- 6. List any and all allergies.
- 7. The Health Tech and/or School Nurse will use discretion on urgency of student request and attempt to call home. If unsuccessful in connecting with proper adult, the student will be returned to class, unless it is medically prohibitive.
