<u>Answer</u>

A. To protect and distribute the zygote.

A seed contains a complete zygote wrapped in a seed coat. The seed's hard outer covering protects the seed until it can be dispersed, by wind or animals, to another location. This adaptation allows for a wider distribution of seed plants than those that do not have seeds.
